On the other-hand, there is nothing more rewarding than seeing a family who were in diabolical conditions now succeeding, seeing the children clean, well dressed and most importantly happy. We have been helping Vica and her siblings for many years now. Vica has been looking after the family since she was about 15 years old when her mother died. She said to me in October "... for the first time everything is good ..." they had a good harvest and food for the winter; wood for the stove.
